CW4 Schemper enlisted the Army in 1990 as a 19D Cavalry Scout. In his eight years as an enlisted soldier he was inducted as a member of the Sergeant Audie Murphy Club and was selected to become a Sergeant First Class. In 1998 he was accepted to attend Warrant Officer Candidate School and flight school. Since then he has logged over 4,000 flight hours, including more than 850 combat/imminent danger. His military flight qualifications include Instructor Pilot and Instrument Examiner in both Fixed-Wing and Rotary-Wing. His FAA flight ratings include Airline Transport Pilot, Commercial Flight Instructor Instrument (CFI/CFII) Single-Engine, Multi-Engine, Rotorcraft. Throughout his career he has flown the UH-1(Huey), UH-60A/L(Blackhawk), RC-12, C-12U/C (King Air), UV-27A (Caravan), UV-18C (Twin Otter) CASA 212 and F-27 Fokker.
