Biographical Sketch

Sergeant First Class Justin W. Blewitt is a 92R parachute rigger serving as a member of the United States Army Parachute Team on the Formation Free Fall Competition Team.

SFC Blewitt joined the Army in May of 2004, attended his initial entry training and was then assigned to Fort Benning, Ga. In the fall of 2005 he chose to attend the Golden Knight Assessment and Selection

Program, which the knights use as a tool to assess a jumpers skydiving trainability as well as their teamwork skills.

Since learning to skydive in 2001 he has done more than 7,500 free fall parachute jumps and 30 military static line jumps.

In 2011 he won four Gold Medals at the U.S. Nationals and 1 Gold at the World Cup at Saarlouis Germany. In 2012 he won three Gold and the overall at the U.S. National Championships 2012. He and his Team brought back Gold from the 2012 World Skydiving Championships in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. In 2013 they took 3 Gold medals from the U.S. Nationals. 2014 brought 3 more National Gold and a World Championship Gold from the Czech Republic.

During his free time he enjoys rock climbing, and snowboarding.
