Capt. Matthew Ingerson an aviator on the U.S. Army Parachute Team Aviation Detachment, currently flies the Golden Knights' C-147A (De Havilland-8-315).

Ingerson was commissioned through the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program as an Aviation Officer in 2011 upon earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice from Northern Arizona University.

After the completion of the Aviation Officer Basic Course and the UH-60M aircraft qualification course at Fort Rucker, Ala., he was assigned to 82nd Combat Aviation Brigade at Fort Bragg, N.C. where he served as a Maintenance Platoon Leader. Ingerson deployed to Afghanistan with 82nd CAB and served as a Company Executive Officer and Battalion Assistant Operations Officer.



Ingerson then attended the Military Intelligence Captain's Career Course and the Fixed-Wing Multiple Engine Qualification Course. Upon completion he was then assigned to the 15th Military Intelligence Battalion as the Senior Logistic Adviser. He then took command of Alpha Company, 15th Military Intelligence Battalion.
