Biographical Sketch

Chief Warrant Officer 3 Levi Siegfried, an Army Aviator, serves as a pilot on the United States Army Parachute Team, nicknamed the Golden Knights.

Siegfried enlisted into the Air Force in 2001 as a 2A5X1L Aircraft Maintenance Technician. In 2008 he was accepted by the Army to attend Warrant Officer Candidate School and the U.S. Army Aviation Center of Excellence. Since then he has logged over 2,600 flight hours, including 5 combat tours as an aviator. Throughout his career he has flown the TH-67 (Creek), OH-58A/C (Kiowa), the AH-64D (Apache), the C-12C/D/U (King Air), the RC-12X (King Air), the EO-5C (Dash 7), and the RO-6A (Dash 8). Currently Mr. Siegfried flies the teams C-147A (Dash 8), and the UV-18C (Twin Otter).

Siegfried's previous assignments include: 552nd Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, Tinker AFB, Okla., 86th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, Ramstein AFB, Germany, 1st Military Intelligence Battalion, Wiesbaden AAF, Germany, and the 204th Military Intelligence Battalion, Fort Bliss, Texas.
