Keith enlisted more than fifteen years ago. He attended Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training as an Infantryman (11B) at Fort Benning, GA.

Throughout his career, duty stations have included Joint Base Lewis McCord, WA serving as an Airborne Ranger on a number of combat deployments, Fort Benning, GA serving as an instructor for the Ranger Assessment and Selection Program (RASP), and Fort Bragg, NC as a Ranger Liaison Sergeant until the assignment to the United States Army Parachute Team in 2016.



Keith has served six tours in Afghanistan, and three tours in Iraq. He has been awarded the Soldiers Medal, Air Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal and Good Conduct Medal.

Since learning to skydive in 2013 he has logged more than 2,300 free fall parachute jumps and 70 military static line jumps.
